

# SCALE – REVIEW

## Purpose

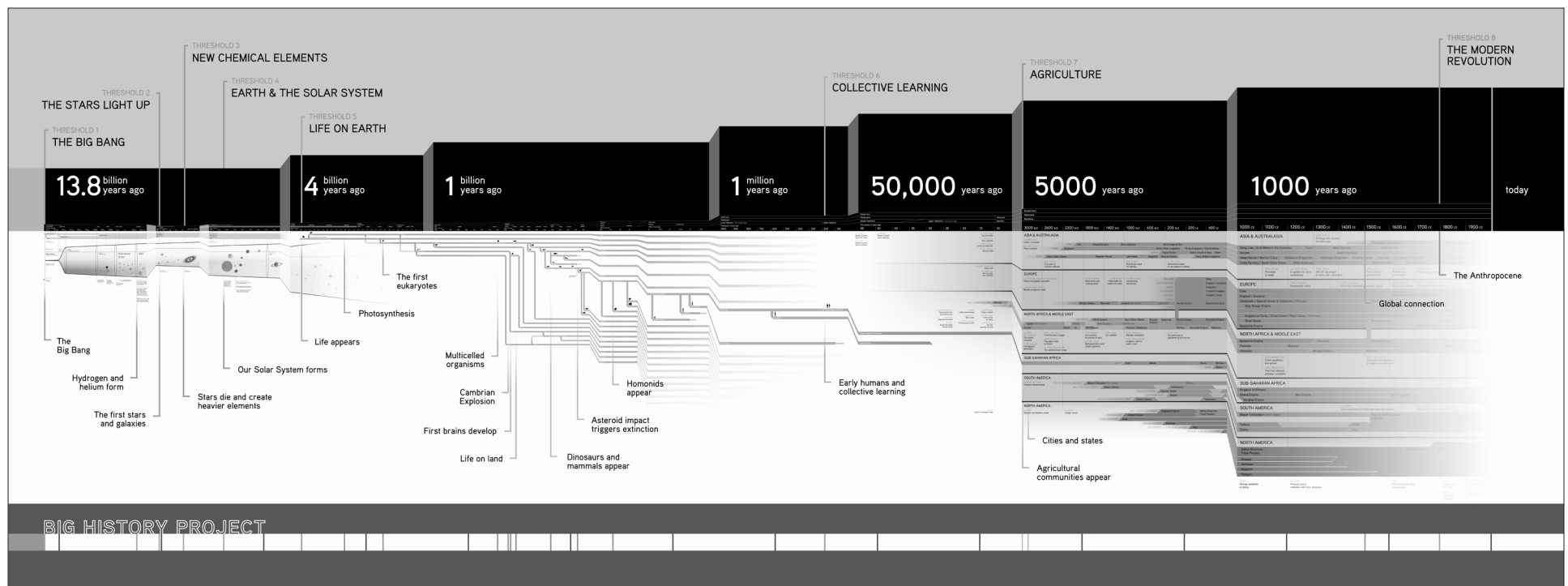
This activity reinforces how important scale is to understanding the Big History story, and really all history stories. This is the final activity in which students will deliberately consider scales of both place and time in relation to the Big History narrative.

## Process

Ask students to think about the resources and activities that have focused on scale throughout the course. Tell them that working alone, they should pick out the three resources or activities in this course that they think have had the most powerful impact on their thinking about scale. However, there are two twists:

1. They can't choose any activity that has "scale" in its title.
2. Not all of their choices can come from the same unit.

Students should use the Scale Worksheet to provide an explanation of why their choices had such a powerful impact on them. Have them write down their responses and be prepared to share their ideas with the class.



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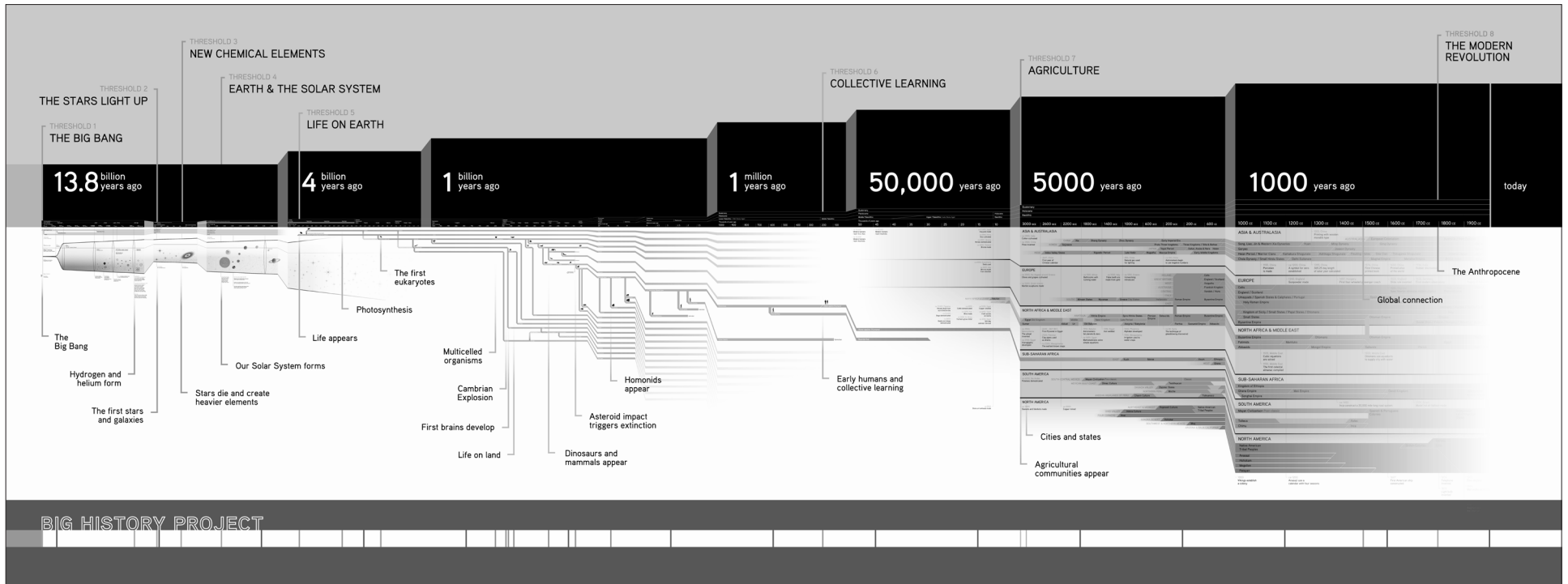
